Confession of Faith

Westminster Shorter Catechism Questions 36-38

Leader: What benefits in this life accompany or flow from justification, adoption and sanctification?

All: The benefits in this life which accompany or flow from justification, adoption and sanctification are: assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, progress in holiness, and perseverance in it to this life's end.

Leader: What benefits do believers receive from Christ at death?

All: The souls of believers are at their death made perfect in holiness and immediately pass into glory; and their bodies, being still united to Christ, rest in their graves until the resurrection.

Leader: What benefits do believers receive from Christ at the resurrection?

All: At the resurrection Christ will immediately raise up in glory all believers; he will openly acknowledge and acquit them in the day of judgement, graciously rewarding them according to their works of faith, and they will enter into the full enjoyment of God for all eternity

Sermon Questions for September 12, 2021
Living in the Joy of God - “God’s Supply ”
Philippians 4:14-20

1. Can you share experiences of how God supplied above and beyond what you expected?
2. Paul thanked the church for sharing in his trouble. What was he specifically referring to? What were some of the other troubles Paul went through? How can we expect trouble as we serve the Lord?
3. The idea of “partnership” is raised by Paul again in verse 15. Where does he first refer to this in the book? What was this “partnership” and what do we learn from it? Have you partnered with a missionary in ministry?
4. The financial aspect of this “partnership” signaled something greater. Was it just money Paul was talking about?
5. Stewardship, though not specifically mentioned, is part of this text. God has entrusted all that you have for you to steward. What ways can you be a better steward of God’s blessings? Are you supporting the worship and work of Peace Presbyterian Church to the best of your ability?
6. Paul as an Apostle inspired by the Holy Spirit to author Scripture promised that God would supply all their needs. Where would God have you act in faith?
